Know what goes in your kerbside bin

Use recyclemate.com.au to search the product you are unsure about, to find out what bin to use, and the condition the container needs to be in to be recycled. If you don't have access to kerbside bins it will direct you to your closest recycling centre.



Return and Earn

The Natural Home Grenfell offers a Return and Earn program for glass, plastic bottles, and cans (for any container with the 10-cent return sticker). They also supply bags and tags to help separate your bottles. Don't forget to count up your bottles and cans before you drop them off! There are Return and Earn stations at Woolworths in Forbes and Cowra too.



Batteries and E-waste

Forbes, Cowra and Young have battery drop-off points at Aldi and Bunnings. They accept AAA, AA, C, D and 9V batteries. Put sticky tape over the ends to prevent them from sparking and drop them off within 6 months of expiry. Oliver's Hardware in Grenfell accepts car batteries for community battery drives. Harvey Norman in Young collects old TVs and computers, just pop them in the green cage in the car park to be recycled.



Bulk Cardboard, Paper, Milk Bottles and Cans

Twin City Recyclers in Forbes and Cowra Materials and Recycling Facility take all these items free of charge. Keep in mind that they don't pay for the cans. They are open 7 am to 2:30pm Monday to Friday.



Agricultural

Cowra Materials Recycling Facility has a Drum Muster on the first Tuesday of the month. It does require booking 48hrs in advance on 02 6340 2140.
