

WATTLE WALKS IN GRENFELL

11 Weddin Community Native Nursery

43 East Street, Grenfell. The nursery has a *Wattle Walk* on the south side of the Nursery that can be accessed at any time. If you are inspired to plant some wattles, the nursery is open Tuesday to Saturday from 9 am to 12 pm.

12 Grenfell Endemic Garden and O'Briens Hill

O'Briens Hill, Grenfell. Features plants that are native to Grenfell and Central West NSW. The endemic garden was a labour of love by two residents, Noel Cartwright and Peter Luthje, and their families. There are also picnic areas and public toilets.

13 Company Dam Flora and Fauna Reserve

Newton Street, Grenfell. Company Dam is just over 2km north-west of Grenfell. There are walking and cycling trails, picnic areas and public toilets.

14 Grenfell Historic Railway

West St, Grenfell. Access visitor information, public toilets and camping areas. Along the railway is a large *Acacia dealbata* (Silver Wattle) stand.

15 Vaughn's Dam Reserve

Between the railway, West Street, Holy Camp Road and Henry Lawson Way is a Box Gum Grassy Woodland remnant. This area has begun to flourish thanks to restoration efforts initiated by Weddin Landcare, which include planting wattles and installing nest boxes. It is an area worth watching!

Safety information

Remember to tell someone of your walking plans. We encourage you to take photos along the walking trails but please do not trespass into private property and please respect the flora and fauna by minimising habitat disturbance.
